### **Exhibitors please note:**

Use of oily substances on leaves is prohibited. Exhibits MUST be grown by the exhibitor. Exhibit cards MUST be under exhibit.

Plants are to be grown in and exhibited in pots (or similar). Hanging containers must not exceed 40cm in diameter.

### POT PLANTS

- Class 426 Maiden hair fern
- Class 427 Fern, any other variety
- Class 428 Foliage plant
- Class 429 Variegated foliage plant
- Class 430 Elkhorn -mounted
- Class 431 Bonsai
- Class 432 Geranium, in flower
- Class 433 Orchid in flower
- Class 434 Flowering plant, grown from bulb, corm, tuber or rhizome
- Class 435 Flowering plants, not previously specified, two or more
- Class 436 Garden, two or more plants in one pot, distinct
- Class 437 Collection of three Cacti or Succulents, separate pots  
(pots no larger than 20cms)
- Class 438 Cacti or Succulent garden, two or more plants in one pot
- Class 439 Patio plant, any size
- Class 440 Collection of three plants, suitable for herbal tea
- Class 441 Plant or plants in an interesting pot

### HANGING CONTAINERS

- Class 442 Maiden Hair Fern
- Class 443 Any variety of fern (not asparagus)
- Class 444 Foliage plant not otherwise specified
- Class 445 Variegated foliage plant
- Class 446 Plant in flower, any variety
- Class 447 Garden, two or more plants (annuals) in novelty container, distinct
- Class 448 Fuchsia, foliage may be exhibited if not in flower
