Exhibits will be disqualified if other than stated number of specimens.

Exhibit cards MUST be attached to exhibits.

Cuts and Specimens in each class are to be in one container unless otherwise specified.

Exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor.

Definitions

Specimen: One bloom only on a bare or leafy stalk according to species. No buds. No laterals.

Cut: More than one bloom or floret, buds, with leaves and laterals according to species.

Distinct: same type, but different colour.

NND: not necessarily distinct.

TRUE GERANIUM: Trailing plant with pink, mauve or blue five petals flower – common name “Cranesbill”.

### FLOWERS CUTS and SPECIMENS

- Class 401 Collection of Old Fashioned/Heritage Roses
- Class 402 Heritage Rose-one with foliage (including David Austin)
- Class 403 Rose, one specimen
- Class 404 Rose, one variety, three stages, bud, perfect and full blown
- Class 405 Rose, Polyanthus or Floribunda  
one cut, must have more than one bloom on stem
- Class 406 Camellia, one specimen with foliage, any variety
- Class 407 Poppies, six specimens any varieties
- Class 408 Sweet Peas, three stems

- Class 409 Pansies or violas, three specimens with collars, separate containers, NND
- Class 410 True Geranium (common name Cranesbill), single, one head with own leaf
- Class 411 Geranium, single, one head with own leaf
- Class 412 Geranium, double, one head with own leaf
- Class 413 Ivy leaf Pelargonium, Ivy leaf, one head with own leaf.
- Class 414 Pelargonium, one head with own leaf
- Class 415 Fuchsia, single, one cut
- Class 416 Fuchsia, double, one cut
- Class 417 Daisies, three specimens any variety
- Class 418 Two Garden Flowers, ANY two different varieties,
- Class 419 Any two flowering native shrubs - separate containers, named
- Class 420 Iris, three Stalks Tall Bearded, distinct, separate containers
- Class 421 Iris, Tall Bearded, one stalk
- Class 422 Iris, Louisiana, one stalk
- Class 423 Three Iris florets, no buds, stems not to exceed 5cm, separate containers
